In addition to good accessibility, slices feature relatively intact synaptic connections that allow a variety of experiments not feasible with standard in vivo or tissue culture preparations. The ability to perform both biochemical and electrophysiological experiments on the same piece of CNS tissue provides additional bright prospects for future research. Although most of the electrophysiological studies have dealt with hippocampal slices, it should be evident from this book that slice methodology is not limited to the hippocampus. The Appendix, "Brain Slice Methods," is a multiauthored treatment of the technical aspects of brain slice work, collected into one document.
